A new generation of doctors accepted degrees from the Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons.

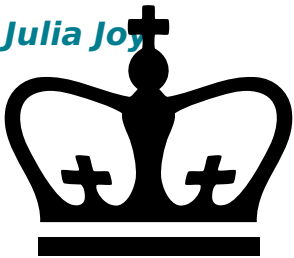
