Gerald Lewis Jr., a law-enforcement professional who has led public-safety departments at several universities, has been named Columbia's vice president of public safety.

Lewis was previously the University of Connecticut's top police officer; before that, he served as chief of police at the University of Texas at San Antonio and at East Carolina University. During his time at UT-San Antonio, Lewis was recognized as campus safety director of the year by *Campus Safety* magazine.

Prior to entering higher education, Lewis was a New Jersey State Police officer for twenty-six years, rising to commanding officer and chief spokesman of the department.

“Gerald brings to Columbia a relentless focus on safety and an unwavering commitment to diversity, inclusion, and community partnerships,” says David M.
